Message from the President:

Amazing how quickly six months goes by, but there has been a lot going on.

We have recently received the good news that our IOBC Symposia have been accepted for the next International Congress of Entomology scheduled for September 2016 in Orlando, Florida. We submitted three symposium topics and are co-sponsoring a fourth: they have all been accepted, see below for details.



The symposium on 'Status and Prospects for Biological Control in the 21st Century' will follow on from a meeting we are planning for later this year to address some of the issues currently facing biological control practice. We are concerned that a number of factors such as the increasing requirements for risk assessment for biological control agent releases, the CBD Access and Benefit Sharing (Nagoya) protocol and other factors are combining to undermine the ability for biological control to be used as an effective component of pest management.

IOBC Global has recognized these increasing pressures, and we have invited a number of high profile speakers from a range of relevant disciplines to address some of these issues at a meeting

later this year. We plan to debate ways in which we can support the crucial need for wider adoption of biological control, particularly in developing countries; to discuss solutions to current and emerging national and international regulatory barriers to cooperation between nations on biological control programmes; and to create a multidisciplinary forum in which to deliberate on opportunities for innovative and collaborative science to optimize biological control success in the future. We have been successful in attracting sponsorship to support this meeting.

The outcomes from this meeting, and some of the key actions will be presented in the ICE symposium, and we encourage our members to attend and support this important initiative and to bring your ideas. We are, of course, confident that biocontrol will survive into the future despite the hurdles we seem to be currently facing. For example, the EU Sustainable Use of Pesticides Directive includes sections requiring IPM programmes.

Some very good news to report is that we now have a restored and functioning IOBC-ATRS Section, and I would like to acknowledge the help that Russell and others have provided to help the new Executive to get up and running.



BioControl, the official journal of IOBC, presents original papers on basic and applied research in all aspects of biological control of invertebrate, vertebrate and weed pests, and plant diseases. Coverage includes biology and ecology of organisms for biological control, and aspects of use including biological controls for integrated pest management, such as plant resistance, pheromones and intercropping. Organisms covered include parasitoids, invertebrate and vertebrate predators of pest animals and plants, mites, plant and insect pathogens, nematodes, and weeds. The journal publishes interdisciplinary papers with a global perspective on the use of biological control in integrated pest management systems, and related developments in molecular biology and biotechnology that have direct relevance.

BioControl also publishes forum papers and invited reviews and Letters to the Editor.
